The following records are taken mainly from the LFS Logbook and are reproduced here in good faith. No attempt has been made to verify these reports in their entirety, but thanks are due to Andrew Cleave, Keith Hiscock, Andy Jayne, Beccy MacDonald, Alan Rowland and Tony Taylor, all of whom have helped to solve various assorted puzzles and to tie up as many loose ends as possible.

WHALES, DOLPHINS AND PORPOISES

Minke whale Balaenoptera acutorostrata

Peacock Inachis io

Recorded on 15 dates between 30 Mar (one) and 28 Oct (one), with a max of just two on 30 Jul and 20 Aug. Individuals seen at VC Quarry on 22 Oct and near Millcombe House on 28 Oct were late in the season (though not as late as that recorded on 27 Nov 2013), probably reflecting the prolonged mild conditions of autumn 2014, though disturbance from hibernation sites is also a possibility. One was also reported on 24 Oct.

Comma Polygonia c-album

There was a tick in the logbook for 24 Jul, but as no further information was provided for what is flagged in the log as an "unusual" species on the island, this should be treated with a degree of caution. The last confirmed record was in Jul 2009.

Speckled wood Pararge aegeria

One in Millcombe on 20 Aug (Richard Taylor & Tony Taylor) was the only record during 2014.

[Wall brown Lasiommata megera

Not recorded in 2014. The last confirmed record was in Apr 2011.]

Grayling Hipparchia semele

Recorded on 15 days between 30 Jun (four) and 8 Aug (one), with four on the first date being the highest count of the year.

[Gatekeeper Pyronia tithonus

Surprisingly, this species was not recorded in 2014, especially as over 20 were reported on 24 Jul 2013. This may indicate a lack of experienced recorders during the species' relatively brief flight season, or perhaps the effects of adverse weather at one or more key stages of its life cycle in 2013/2014. LFS Members are invited to keep a particular lookout for Gatekeepers in the summers of 2015 & 2016.]

Meadow brown Maniola jurtina

Recorded on 36 days between 7 Jun (one) and 21 Aug (two), with a max of 194 on 2 Jul. Both first emergence and peak numbers were between two and three weeks ahead of 2013, reflecting the combined effects of a cool, late spring in 2013 and the altogether much warmer, sunnier spring and early summer of 2014.

Ringlet Aphantopus hyperantus

Following a complete blank in 2013, Ringlets were recorded in small numbers in 2014, with sightings on 11 dates between 28 Jun (two) and 24 Jul (presence only), and a max of eight on 30 Jun. This indicates that while successful breeding must have occurred on the island in summer 2013, low numbers, poor weather, and/or a lack of experienced observers at the right time led to none being recorded that year. Hopefully the better weather of summer 2014 will result in larger numbers flying in 2015.

3 to 8 Nov - Occasional plants still in flower (Sandra Rowland & Marie Jo Coutanche).

Common sorrel Rumex acetosa

28 Jun to 5 Jul - Present (Sandra Rowland).

Thrift Armeria maritima

25 May – A very impressive show, along with **Common bird's-foot-trefoil** *Lotus corniculatus* and **Kidney vetch** *Anthyllis vulneraris* on Lametor (Paul Holt).

Marsh St John's-wort Hypericum elodes

6 Jul – Recorded at Pondsbury (Jan Armishaw).

8 Jul – Very well established on bog just north of the western end of Threequarter Wall (Jan Armishaw).

Common mallow Malva sylvestris

28 Jun to 5 Jul – Present (Sandra Rowland).

Round-leaved sundew Drosera rotundifolia

6 Jul – Recorded at Pondsbury (Jan Armishaw).

Creeping willow Salix repens

6 Jul – Recorded at Pondsbury (Jan Armishaw).

Thale cress Arabidopsis thaliana

18 to 20 May – Flowering outside Tavern (by benches near toilets) and in Millcombe (Andrew Cleave).

Danish scurvygrass Cochlearia danica

3 Jun - In flower in the south of the island (Roger & Rosy Key, Steve Compton).

Common scurvygrass Cochlearia officinalis

3 Jun – In flower on glass cullet in the Landing Bay (Roger & Rosy Key, Steve Compton).

Lundy cabbage Coincya wrightii

- 24 Apr A plant in full flower in lower Millcombe, near the gate to the Lower East Side Path, was grazed off by a goat an hour later!
- 1 Jun Roger & Rosy Key and Steve Compton wrote: "What a peculiar year for Lundy cabbage – high numbers, many not yet in flower, many gone over, and those at South End of the island (south of Sugar Loaf) flowering very poorly – few, small flowers per plant, very difficult to count. North of Miller's Cake ± normal. Not sure what's going on."

28 Jul - Still in flower alongside upper Beach Road (Beccy MacDonald).

Rhododendron Rhododendron ponticum

About 50 seedlings above the Quarries to the north of the Old Hospital (Alan Rowland).

Bog pimpernel Angallis tenella

- 6 Jul Recorded at Pondsbury (Jan Armishaw).
- 8 Jul Very well established on bog just north of the western end of Threequarter Wall (Jan Armishaw).

Scarlet pimpernel Anagallis arvensis

17–21 May – Common in many parts of the island (Alan Rowland).

Navelwort (= Wall Pennywort) *Umbilicus rupestris* 28 Jun to 5 Jul – Present (Sandra Rowland).

English stonecrop *Sedum anglicum* 28 Jun to 5 Jul – Present (Sandra Rowland).

Tormentil Potentilla erecta

17 to 21 May – Common in many parts of the island (Alan Rowland). 1 Nov – Occasional plants still in flower (Sandra Rowland).

Greater bird's-foot-trefoil *Lotus pedunculatus* 28 Jun to 5 Jul – Present (Sandra Rowland).

Common bird's-foot-trefoil *Lotus corniculatus* 17–21 May – Common in many parts of the island (Alan Rowland).

Wood vetch Vicia sylvatica

1 Jun – In flower towards the bottom of the Beach Road (Shelley Southon). 6 Jul – Still in flower in the same location (Andrew Cleave).

Red clover *Trifolium pratense* 28 Jun to 5 Jul – Present (Sandra Rowland).

Hare's-foot clover *Trifolium arvense* 28 Jun to 5 Jul – Present (Sandra Rowland).

White clover Trifolium repens

28 Jun to 5 Jul – Present (Sandra Rowland).

Allseed Radiola linoides

6 & 7 Jul – Along track to the Battery (Jan Armishaw, Andrew Cleave).

Milkwort species Polygala sp.

17 to 21 May – Common in many parts of the island (Alan Rowland). 1 Nov – Occasional plants still in flower (Sandra Rowland).

Dove's-foot crane's-bill Geranium molle

28 Jun to 5 Jul – Present (Sandra Rowland).

Sea stork's-bill Erodium maritimum

5 Jun – Extensive patches around North Light (Roger & Rosy Key, Steve Compton).

Fool's-water-cress Apium nodiflorum

6 Jul – Flourishing in ditch near the Church (Andrew Cleave).

Wild angelica Angelica sylvestris

30 Jul – In full flower just below the Lower East Side Path, above White Beach (Tim Davis & Tim Jones).

Knotted hedge-parsley Torilis nodosa

July & September – A few plants in the Old Light compound (David Green & Andrew Cleave) – see colour plate 3

Common centaury Centaurium erythraea

6 Jul - On track near the Castle (Andrew Cleave).

Black nightshade Solanum nigrum

14 Aug – Group of *c*.50 plants in hollow above Benjamin's Chair (Alan & Sandra Rowland) – see colour plate 3.

Water forget-me-not Myosotis scorpioides

28 Jun to 5 Jul – Present (Sandra Rowland).

Wood sage Teucrium scorodonia

17-21 May - Common in many parts of the island (Alan Rowland).

Selfheal Prunella vulgaris

28 Jun to 5 Jul – Present (Sandra Rowland).

Wild thyme *Thymus polytrichus* 28 Jun to 5 Jul – Present (Sandra Rowland).

Balm-leaved figwort Scrophularia scorodonia

 3 Jun – Plants along the Beach Road and in Millcombe showing abundant larval spinning thought to refer to the micro-moth *Nothris congressariella* (Roger & Rosy Key, Steve Compton).
 6 Jul – Recorded halfway up the Beach Road (Jan Armishaw).

Ivy-leaved toadflax *Cymbalaria muralis* 28 Jun to 5 Jul – Present (Sandra Rowland).

Foxglove *Digitalis purpurea* 28 Jun to 5 Jul – Present (Sandra Rowland).

Lousewort Pedicularis sylvatica

17-21 May - Common in many parts of the island (Alan Rowland).

Broomrape species Orobanche sp.

2 Jun – At least six flower spikes at Quarry Bay (Roger & Rosy Key and Steve Compton).

Greater broomrape Orobanche rapum-genistaei 7 Jul – On prostrate broom *Cytisus*, high up on ledge in VC Quarry (Andrew Cleave).

Sheep's-bit Jasione montana 28 Jun to 5 Jul – Present (Sandra Rowland).

Honeysuckle *Lonicera periclymenum* 28 Jun to 5 Jul – Present (Sandra Rowland).

Intermediate burdock Arctium x nothum 6 Jul – Recorded halfway up the Beach Road (Jan Armishaw).

Daisy Bellis perennis

1 Nov – Occasional plants still in flower (Sandra Rowland).

Yarrow Achillea millefolium 28 Jun to 5 Jul – Present (Sandra Rowland).

Hemp-agrimony Eupatorium cannabinum

3 Jun – Beside stream in Quarter Wall Combe (Roger & Rosy Key and Steve Compton).

Common cottongrass Eriophorum angustifolium

6 Jul – Recorded at Pondsbury (Jan Armishaw).

Common spike-rush Eleocharis palustris

6 Jul – Recorded at Pondsbury (Jan Armishaw).

Bog asphodel Narthecium ossifragum

2 Jul - Hundreds flowering on wet heath on eastern side of Pondsbury (Alan & Sandra Rowland).

Yellow iris Iris pseudacorus 28 Jun to 5 Jul – Present (Sandra Rowland).

Heath spotted-orchid Dactylorhiza maculata

8 Jun – One near Threequarter Wall (E. Stewart). 2 Jul – Hundreds flowering on wet heath on eastern side of Pondsbury (Alan & Sandra Rowland).

LICHENS

Cladonia coccifera - recorded near Tibbetts.

Golden hair lichen Teloschistes flavicans

17 to 21 May – Recorded in the vicinity of North West Point (Alan Rowland).

12 Jul – Several clumps near North Light; also on rocks on northern side of Jenny's Cove.

FUNGI

St George's mushroom *Calocybe gambosa* (formerly *Tricholoma gambosum*) 18 May – In Millcombe, on verge under trees just below the Battlements (Andrew Cleave).

Veiled poisonpie Hebeloma mesophaeum

6 Nov – On east side of track near Quarter Wall (Rachel Threlkeld). This species is not listed in Hedger *et al.* 2010. Lundy Fungi: Further Surveys 2004–2008. *Journal of the Lundy Field Society*, Vol. 2, pp.21–44, and the record is therefore subject to verification.
